Interreg V = 107 Territorial <u>Cooperation Programmes</u> in preparation for 2014-2020 with a budget of EUR 10.1 billion ("CPs" as opposed to OPs for the IfGJ goal ⊕)

□ Interreg V-A toolbox

- □ Dec. 2013 legislative package 2014-2020 in application (Reg. 1303/2013, 1301 (ERDF) & 1299 (ETC) & 1302 (EGTC)
- □ Territorial cooperation (= Interreg programmes) becomes one of the 2 goals of cohesion policy ...and 2.8% of its budget
- 2014-2020 Programmes to be submitted to the Commission by **22 September (2014!)** at the latest (Art. 26(4) Reg. 1303/2013)
- Commission implementing acts listing **geographical coverage** and **ERDF funding per Interreg programme** adopted 16 June 2014 (Art. 3-4 ETC)



- □ Key elements of the 2014-2020 reform
 - □ Strategy
 - Results
 - □ Concentration
 - ☐ Important to respect **partnership principle & multigovernance** (Art. 5 Reg. 1303/2013)
 - Written confirmation of participants' agreement to the whole programme, including strategy, co-financing & management and control structures (Art. 8§9 Reg. 1299/2013)


