

# REPURPOSING HERITAGE FOR CITIZENS



Transforming an old ceramics factory into a cultural and leisure hub







# What happens when heritage stops being just a memory of the past and becomes a driving force for the present?

In Onda, a town of 25,000 inhabitants located in the heart of the Valencian Region (Spain) and with a deep-rooted ceramics tradition, the former ceramics factory *La Campaneta* has been rehabilitated and transformed into a vibrant cultural and community space that strenghtens local life and brings people together. This experience, recognised as a URBACT Good Practice, is now ready to be shared with other European cities looking to give new meaning to their heritage as a tool for social cohesion and sustainable urban development.

#### LA CAMPANETA

La Campaneta is one of the oldest ceramic factories in Onda and a symbol of the city's industrial past. Built in the 19th century and officially recognised as a protected local heritage site, it still preserves original elements such as three Moorish kilns. Located at the intersection of three previously disconnected neighbourhoods, the building now plays a key role in bringing people and places together.

Its rehabilitation, co-financed by the European Regional Development Fund (ERDF) and the Onda City Council, led not only to a physical transformation, but also to a symbolic one: a forgotten space that has been brought back to life with new purpose.







## **Key features of the intervention:**

- Architectural rehabilitation respecting the original structure
- Conservation of symbolic heritage elements such as kilns, clay vessels and mills
- Creation of a multifunctional space for culture, community engagement and local events
- A participatory process involving residents from the very beginning

## **LOCAL IMPACT**



**Over 70% of the population benefited**, either directly by participating in activities, or indirectly through the improvement of the surroundings and a renewed sense of belonging



3 neighbourhoods reconnected, creating a new urban meeting point



Economic revitalisation of the surrounding area, supporting local shops and hospitality



A **new cultural destination** in the city, attracting new visitors



**Improved urban image,** from an abandoned factory to an open, vibrant community space



**Dozens of annual activities,** including workshops, exhibitions, concerts and educational events for all audiences
